EVE BOLTON

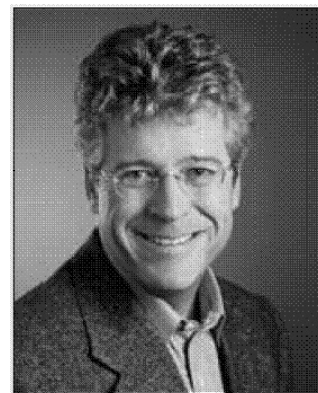

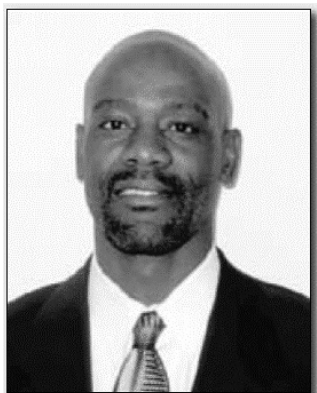
MICHAEL FLANNERY
